Prof. Kok Ann Gwee (Singapore)

A wonderful and sharp selection by Professor Gwee from Singapore, this prospective multi-centre study by the Indian Society of Gastroenterology's IBS Taskforce with data from 4500 community subjects involving 2785 patients with chronic lower GI symptoms presenting at 30 nation-wide centres in India .

Most patients were middle aged men. By contrast, the typical IBS patient in the West is often a young female.

"By not being shackled to conventional criteria, this study reaffirms to me that the IBS patient that I see can be different from the image created in Rome."

Gastro 2009 is offering 200 Travel grants of € 1.000 each for clinician-scientists of a maximum of 35 years old (born on January 1, 1974 and later) and younger for the best abstracts.

100 Travel grants of € 1.000 each will also be offered to non-clinical scientists of a maximum age of 40 years old (born on January 1, 1969 and later) and younger for best submitted basic science abstracts. The application for non-clinical scientists must be supported by a letter from the Head of Department.

All Travel grants are awarded on the basis of scientific merit using the evaluation process of the Gastro 2009 Programme Committee.
